# LAURENS COUNTY DEFEATS OTEHO COUNTY IN SENATE RACE

## Milam, Culbertson, Wasson Named to House; Fleming, Blakely, Wharton Re-elected

### MAYBANK WINS NOMINATION ON FIRST BALLOT

Defeats Four Opponents, Dorn Second, Bennett Third.

Columbia, Aug. 11.—Senator Robert Elliott Maybank, never beaten in a South Carolina election, outdistanced four opponents in the Democratic primary Tuesday and appeared to be the almost certain winner of a one-year term without a run-off.

Returned from 1,230 of the state's 1,426 precincts gave Maybank 130,474 votes to 53,829 for former Republican Senator Bryan Dorn, for Maybank 38,131 for Bennett, 12,316 for Johnstone and 10,992 for Stueck.

Maybank was leading in all of the state's 46 counties and every vote of the 10,320 precincts was increased by his majority in an election where Negroes voted freely.

A tide of Maybank votes from the western part of the state, where the mayor began his rise to the top of the political state politics in the county or established his mastery as the county's preeminent politician in the one-third mark.

Maybank, who has been in Charleston as in other larger cities, their singularly quiet rights secured in Reconstruction.

Maybank's opponents assailed him for recommending a federal judge, Judge J. Walter Waring, who had declined the Negro ballot and equal membership in the Democratic party.

Maybank, however, also had criticized Waring's rulings during the campaign and pointed out that he had been the first to denounce the Negroes.

In the Third Congressional district, left open when Dorn decided to run for Congress, he was leading three rivals, with one Negro vote.
