HOUSE AND HOME

Add a tablespoon of glycerine to the lukewarm rinsing water for sweaters, knit dresses and woolen garments and you'll find they will not so much suffer than with plain water.

For wet soiled underclothes, wring them around the washboard and let them soak in hot water. Scurb with a brush after soaking.

To prevent blotches from new shoes, place a small piece of adhesive tape where the shoes tend to rub the feet.

Linten materials will be more stiff and less pliable if you wash them to the last rinse water in laundering.

Use betweens points to cover old clothes hangers and this will prevent your sweaters, woollen and silk. Clothes hangers may also be covered with this wax if you want to make them match your coat accessories.

Old Turkish towels may be soiled from hand towels by the small dye for an extra supply of wash colors. Keep only salt stains in an old coffee can or glass jar with a cover, so they will not gather dust while left.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

- Boston Fudge Cake**
 (Makes 2 8-inch layers)
 one half cup shortening
 2 cups brown sugar
 2 eggs
 one and one fourth sifted cake flour
 1 teaspoon soda
 one half teaspoon salt
 one half cup milk
 one half cup
 2 squares chocolate, melted
 1 teaspoon vanilla
 Cream shortening and add sugar, then water and eggs. Mix together dry ingredients and add to creamed mixture alternately with sour milk and water. Add melted chocolate and vanilla. Pour into greased and floured pans and bake in a moderate (350 degrees F) oven for 30 to 35 minutes. When cool, spread chocolate or white icing between layers and all over cake.

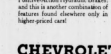

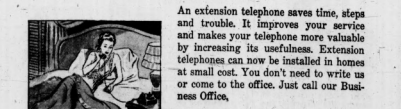
