State Democratic Party Supports Thurmond, Pro-Truman Electors Heeded By Williams.

Columbia, Oct. 23.—For the first time in at least 20 years there is a general election in South Carolina traditionally held Democratic State Convention is taking place here.

Since 1916 there hardly has been a year that did not find the state would follow the national Democratic party.
