College Students
Favor Thurmond
In Straw Ballot

J. Strom Thurmond, candidate for U. S. president in the State Rights ticket, was named as the Prohibition college student body choice for the post in a poll conducted in chapel Friday. Thomas E. Dewey was second choice in the students, while the best President Truman could do was a weak third.

Behind the top three were Henry Wallace, with four votes; Norman Thomas, Socialist candidate, with four also; "Hummer" Herman, Tailor-made, with three votes; and Jailer Shihli (PC professor) with one write-in.

In answer to the other questions asked on the poll, students named Purvis, Illinois Smith ball pouch, as the favorite campus article, while the most popular part of the campus weekly, said voted overwhelmingly "yes" in favor of new band uniforms.

In counting the ballots, The Blue Stacking editors arrived at the following conclusion: 59% of the students in his race for the presidency, 50% will vote for Dewey, and 20% for Truman.
