Escaped Convict Captured; Stole Six Automobiles

Sheriff's officers of Newberry county, accompanied by city Policeman Obie Willingham, arrested Marion Suber, one of the convicts who escaped from the county stockade three weeks ago, near Senn's store in the Longshore community Friday night. When he was arrested, Suber was riding in a 1947 Chevrolet, which officials say he admitted stealing in Chester Wednesday night.

Suber also is said to have admitted stealing a jeep in Charlotte on March 5, driving it to Newberry county where he ran out of gas and abandoned it. He said he went to Silverstreet and entered Sheppard's store and the school lunch room, and from there to Clinton and forced his way into two schools and Giles Chevrolet Co., stealing a 1947 Chevrolet, driving it to Newberry county where he ran into a ditch and abandoned it, walked about two miles and entered Miller's store on Pope street, stealing a bicycle and riding it nearly to Spearman's crossing. He hitchhiked to Saluda where he entered the school and then stole a 1947 Chevrolet.

He drove to Chester where he gave out of gas and abandoned the car. In Chester he stole the 1947 Chevrolet in which he was captured. Before his capture, the battery in the Chevrolet went dead and he left this car near Wallenzine's store and walked to Clinton where he stole another 1947 Chevrolet which ran out of gas near Joanna. He walked to Joanna and stole a 1929 Ford, driving it back to Wallenzine's store. He switched the Ford and Chevrolet batteries and broke into the gas pump.

Milam, Culbertson Vote Against New Council Bill

Columbia, March 15.—The house of representatives last week approved bills to set up a legislative council for the general assembly and to regulate the hours and days of work of state employees.

The house adopted an amendment to the bill to set up a legislative council which rewrote the original bill. The amendment would set up a council of 14 members, seven from the house and seven from the senate. Pay would be limited to a \$7.50 per diem for ten meetings a year. A director of the research, reference and drafting divisions would be elected by the council, subject to approval by the general assembly, and would receive \$7,000 annually. The bill, as amended, was passed by an 88 to 18 roll call vote, with Laurens county Representatives C. B. Culbertson and C. L. Milam voting with the minority, while Representative Robert C. Wasson voted with the majority.

A bill to regulate the hours of work of state employees was approved by a 64 to 37 vote. The Laurens county delegation voted with the majority. The bill provided that no state employee work over 48 hours a week, and provided that state offices could work on a five-day basis with a 40-hour week, except that every department should remain open on Saturday with sufficient personnel to handle any necessary business. The bill would not apply to state employees "whose salaries are not paid in toto by the state of South Carolina."

Support the Wild Life Bill

To Laurens County Citizens:

The present critical wildlife situation is due to many faults; however I believe all the detailed faults could be grouped under two basic causes: First, the political dominated system of wildlife administration which still exists in South Carolina; second, public neglect or indifference to the welfare of wildlife.

The first aggravates the second and visa versa thus dragging wildlife into a vicious whirlpool of insane practices.

Any resource is the foundation of an industry. In 1946 South Carolina's wildlife resources were in depleted condition; yet wildlife was a four billion dollar industry in the nation that year. According to figures giving the total retail sales of other industries for the same year, fishing and hunting ranked above filling stations, above drug stores and above retail liquor and jewelry combined.

South Carolina could rank high among states capitalizing on that industry. Yet practically all of the chambers of commerce throughout the state are peacefully dozing while a handful of sportsmen fight desperately to save the expiring wildlife resources.

The game and fish commission bill was passed by the S. C. house of representatives on March 2. That bill is designed to divorce politics from game administration. Passage of the bill will not be a "cure all" for wildlife; but it will heal many ills.

In addition to eliminating political administration it will require that all of the sportsmen's dollars (license fees) and other revenues derived from game and fish be spent either protecting or developing wildlife. At present only 55 per cent of license fees are retained by the game and fish department. The other 45 goes to other causes, which in no way help game or fish.

The fate of wildlife in South Carolina is now hanging in the balance. It has required years of effort on part of sportsmen to obtain a chance for improvement.

It is now up to you. Your support will mean much. Your support alone may be the little extra bit that can pass the bill.

The most important thing you can do at the present time to support the commission bill is to write to your county senator and representatives. Ask them to work for speedy passage of the bill. And don't delay, because it will defeat a just cause.

Sen. Wilson Introduces Bill Affecting Bonds Town of Clinton

Columbia, March 15.—Senator R. T. Wilson, of Laurens county, introduced a bill last week to authorize the town council of Clinton to additionally secure general obligation bonds of the town of Clinton by pledging revenues derived by the town from the operation of its waterworks system, sewerage system and electric light system.

The bill states that "the general assembly finds that petitions containing the signatures of a majority of the freeholders of the town of Clinton... have been presented to the town council, petitioning that body to order an election" on two questions, the issuance of not more than a \$350,000 general obligation bonds to extend and improve the existing waterworks system, sewerage system and electric light system, and not more than \$100,000 in bonds to pay the town's share of installing permanent improvements on streets and sidewalks of the town. If the election results favorably and if the bonds are issued, the town council may pledge revenues from the operation of its waterworks system, sewerage system and electric light system, not otherwise or previously pledged.

Miss Nell Wham, 64, died Saturday afternoon at the home of her brother, George S. Wham, in Mountville, after several years of declining health.

A native of Laurens county and daughter of the late James and Maggie Shell Wham, she had been employed in the sales department of Myers-Arnold Co., in Greenville 27 years and was a member of St. Paul's Methodist church in Greenville.

Surviving are one sister, Mrs. W. T. Mahaffey, of Greenville, and the brother, Mr. Wham.
