

22 Drunken Drivers Arrested In County

Special to The Chronicle. Columbia, May 4. - A total of 22 driving privileges were withdrawn in Laurens county last month, it has been reported by H. E. Quarles, Jr., director of the motor vehicle division of the S. C. State Highway Department. The suspensions were all made on charges of driving under the influence of liquor, and all of the offenders were male. . Of the Laurens county drivers

whose licensese were withdrawn during March, nine were in the 17 to 30 age grouping, eight were between 30 and 40, and five were forty years of age or older.

In the state as a whole, 527 driving privileges were suspended, of which 522 were on charges of drunk, en driving and five on charges of reckless driving.
