RECIPE OF THE WEEK Banna Chiffon Pie (Makes 1 9-inch pie) tablespoon unflavored gelatin 1/4 cup cold water 1 cup mashed bananas teaspoon grated lemon rind tablespoons sugar 2 egg yolks 1/4 cup lemon juice 2 egg whites tablespoons sugar 1 baked 9-inch pie shell Dissolve gelatin in cold water. Place banana, lemon rind, 4 table-

spoons sugar and egg yolks in saucepan. Heat slowly, stirring constantly until thickened. Remove from heat and add gelatin and lemon juice. maining 4 tablespoons sugar slowly. Fold into banana mixture. Pour into baked pie shell. Chill. Top with whipped cream, if desired. THE CHRONICLE






