**Four Cardiac Clinics Set Up In State By Heart Association**

Columbia, June 8.—The South Carolina Heart association is now setting up cardiac clinics in Charleston, Greenville, Spartanburg, and Columbia, it was announced this week by H. M. McElveen, executive secretary of the association. The clinic will serve the entire state, he pointed out, with persons in any South Carolina county attending the clinic nearest them.

Laurens county residents will attend the clinics in Greenville or Spartanburg, and can be referred there by a physician or can make personal application, McElveen said.

The association plans to establish a cardiac clinic in each medical district in South Carolina, to serve the entire district, as soon as funds are available. Laurens county is in medical district number three, which is composed of Abbeville, Greenwood, Laurens, McCormick and Newberry counties. The member of the heart association's board of directors from district three is Dr. W. L. Pressly of Due West.

At the May meeting at Myrtle Beach, the association allotted \$5,000 to be used in all the counties of the state for the hospitalization of congenital heart cases. The cases would be referred to hospitals from the nearest heart clinic.

**Highway Accidents Show Big Jump For Month of April**

Columbia, June 8.—Highway accidents reported in South Carolina during April numbered 780, with 535 of the total taking place on state highways, according to a report of the state highway department. Thirty-five persons were killed and 296 were injured during the month in motor vehicle accidents, with accidents taking place on state highways being responsible for 30 of the deaths and 253 of the injuries.

In Laurens county, a total of eleven traffic accidents were reported during the month, with eight of the

accidents occurring on state highways. Two persons were killed in accidents in the county, and nine persons received injuries. All of the deaths and injuries resulted from accidents on state highways.

Six of the Laurens county accidents resulted in damage of property. Three of these accidents occurred on state highways, according to the report.
