The inevitable happened last Saturday night Clemson roared through the weaker Presbyterian Blue Hose to a lop sided 69-7 victory. A few people might have said they thought P. C. stood a chance against the Tigers, but I believe everyone knew that the Blue Stockings were no match for the Southern Conference champions of last year.

On the brighter side of the sports the Clinton high school Red Devils tied a strong Union club in a 13 to 13 deadlock and came the nearest to defeating the Yellow Jackets that they've come in four years.

Curtis Freeman kept the Union boys working through the entire game, trying to match the tallies which he racked up for the roaring Red Devils.

P. C. Downed by Clemson Presbyterian went to Clemson with a slight hope of giving the Tigers a good tight ball game but the small flickering hope was smothered beneath the thundering fleet feet of Ray Matthews, Fred Cone, and the pass snatching and defensive work of Gil Rushton.

The big bengals counted scores in every quarter as they sprinted up and down the field at will, to charge

their big 69 points. "Wild man" Watts galloped off sixty six yards in the final quarter to rack up P. C.'s lone score.

The stands gave Watts quite an ovation since it was the first time the Presbyterians had scored upon the Tigers in six years.

P. C. did make the Clemson line appear to be very weak in comparison with the last year's forward wall but in the opinion of many the fault doesn't lie with Clemson's defense but with the Blue Hose's offense. The Hose offense has improved a great deal since last year and although they were up against great odds the big blue team gave the spectators the idea that they will be hard to hold in competition in their own class.

Red Devils Hook With Union The CHS Red Devils romped up field and down field but couldn't do anymore than tie the Union Yellow Jackets with a 13 to 13 count.

Clinton held a slight edge over the Union boys in statistics by reeling off 208 yards gained by rushing while the Jackets pounded out 204 yards.

Curtis Freeman gave the Red Devils a lead and the fans a thrill with his 55 yard sprint to pay dirt in the second quarter.

The Red Devils retired happily at the half with a seven to nothing lead after Richard Hampton kicked the extra point of Freeman's T. D.

Clinton started off strong in the third quarter by holding down the Union threats.

Curtis Freeman became restless and dashed off another long sprint to six points. This gallop was totaled at 85 yards and another Devil dividend.

The Clinton club now lead with thirteen points but Union took advantage of a couple of breaks and scored once in the third quarter and again in the fourth to hook everything up in a 13 to 13 knot.

In the fleeting moments of the game Clinton recovered a Union fumble on the five yard line and drove to the two yard marker. It was then that the Clinton club was victim of a freakish play.

The play was this: Hampton flipped a lateral to McElhannon who juggled the ball momentarily but long enough for Union's Kingsmore to intervene and grab the ball on a dead run.

He sprinted 65 yards before Curtis Freeman overtook him and brought him down. Then Kingsmore fumbled and it was once more Clinton's ball but instead of being on Union's two yard line they were now on their own 35.

This was the last threat to score made by either team.
