Notes From The County Agent's Office

Notice received from H. A. Woodlee, Chairman of the State Pasture Committee, Clemson College, changing their recommendation in the use of Ladino clover from two to three pounds to one to two pounds per acre. The recommendation due to farmers' better preparation of land and to help reduce the danger of bloat among cattle. The recommendation of amount of fescue from 15 to 20 pounds per acre remains the same.

Those farmers who have not seeded their fall grazing are urged to do so at once in order to get a good growth before cold weather. Grazing should be approximately four inches high before grazing. We cannot stress the importance of applying at least 600 pounds of fertilizer and at least one ton of lime per acre, if land has not been limed within the last two years, before seeding, mixing well into the soil.

By all means inoculate the clover before seeding, using at least four times the amount of inoculation as recommended on the container. The fescue and clover should be lightly covered at once after seeding to prevent the sun from killing the clover inoculatin.

In checking local seed stores, reports show that over 7,000 pounds of fescue seed and 3,200 pounds of Ladino Clover seed sold so far this season. One dealer stated that he will sell over eight times more fescue and Ladino Clover as last year. Several farmers harvested and are selling home grown seed also. This pasture program will fit all size farmers who own a goat to a herd of cattle or hogs. No better soil conservation program than to cover the soil with grass and nothing more beautiful during the winter than the hillsides throughout Laurens County covered with a blanket of green.

Checking Five-Acre Cotton
The eleven farmers are being checked as to yield on their five-acre cotton contest. Those who are completing the contest are: C. R. Bobo, Billy Ray Babb, and John H. Kennedy, col., Gray Court; Jeff H. Wood, Ware Shoals, Rt. 1; Milton Blakely, Ora; Robert M. Cain, Mose Madden and Ernest Hudgens, col., Laurens; Ray Franklin, col., and M. T. Rice, col., Clinton; Clyde Saxon, col., Fountain Inn.

Farmers should take special care in storing good planting seed. From indications, planting seed in the lower part of the state will be scarce. Any local farmer needing planting seed for next year should locate such seed at once.

Taking Orders for Tree Seedlings
The season is at hand for placing orders for pine tree seedlings. Landowners may purchase 3,000 pine tree seedlings for 50 cents per 1000 trees which is express charges. All trees ordered above the 3,000 costs \$3.00 per 1,000 delivered to nearest express office. Any one wishing to order seedlings are asked to contact the County Agent's office and file application blank.

Trees should be planted on lands best suited to trees. Timber growing is a money crop and should be looked upon as such. All timber should be cut on a selective cutting basis; that is, cutting out undesirable trees such as forked tops, crooked tops, decayed or too thick a stand. The State District Forest office, Newberry, is in position to assist in your forestry problems as well as the County Agent's office. The planting of pine tree seedlings qualifies a farmer for soil building practice to be used out of his soil building allowance for the farm.
