The property was recently bought by Mr. Plaxico for \$15,500 at public auction to satisfy a mortgage indebtedness held by a local bank. Dr. M. A. Macdonald, president of the institution, said yesterday that the property was purchased by the executive committee for the use of the orphanage, which has been contemplating the construction of a freezing unit. He did not state the purchase price.

Mr. Plaxico said yesterday that the property will be turned over to the new owner on October 31. He also stated that in the transaction he retained a vacant lot adjoining the building.

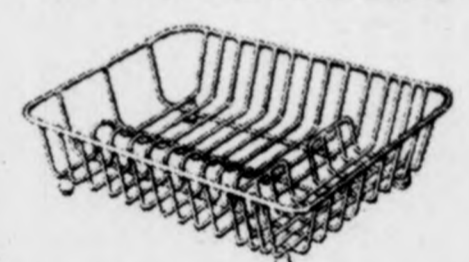

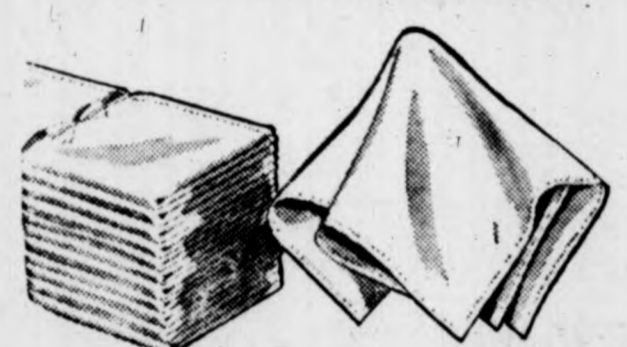
