A U. S. Army exhibit depicting the Army's progress in meeting the challenge of the nuclear age and featuring an actual HAWK missile, will be shown at Presbyterian College on February 25.

Clinton residents and school children are invited to see this exhibit entitled "Cavalcade of Progress" on display between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Admission is free of charge.

The display will be housed in a special trailer parked between the Douglas House and Bailey Hall. Cadets of the Presbyterian ROTC department, which is sponsoring this project, will serve as guides.

Coming to Clinton from Washington, D. C., this Army exhibit shows some of the end-products of the military's research and development program with emphasis on operational combat equipment.

Purpose of the official display is to point up some of the truly significant military developments often overshadowed by the dramatic impact of guided missiles and satellite launchings.

The 16-foot HAWK is a fantastic surface-to-air missile that can swoop down and destroy enemy aircraft at tree-top level.

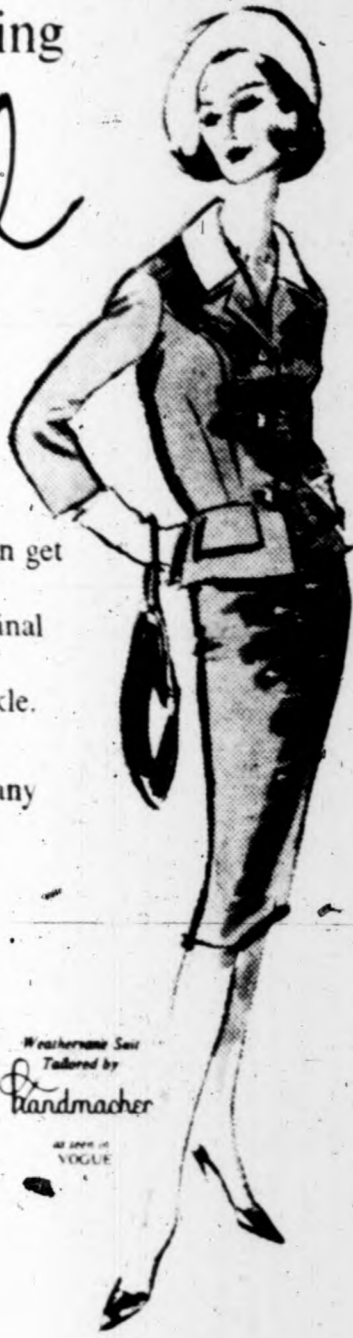

Application forms will be given at the door. Those having sent in their application form will be notified by mail as to where and when to appear for tests.

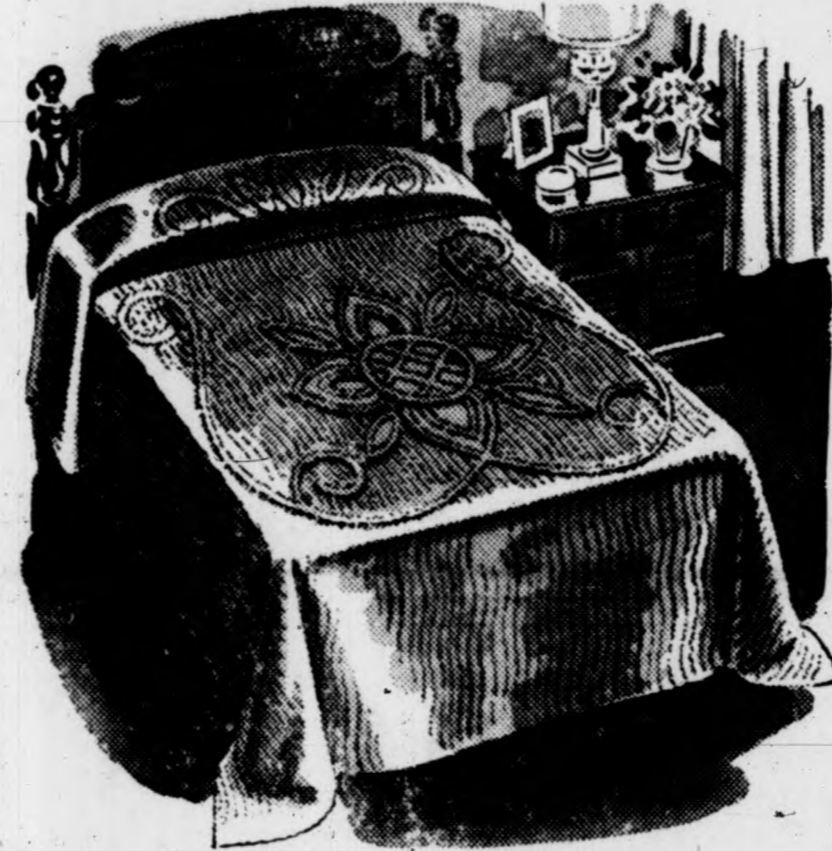

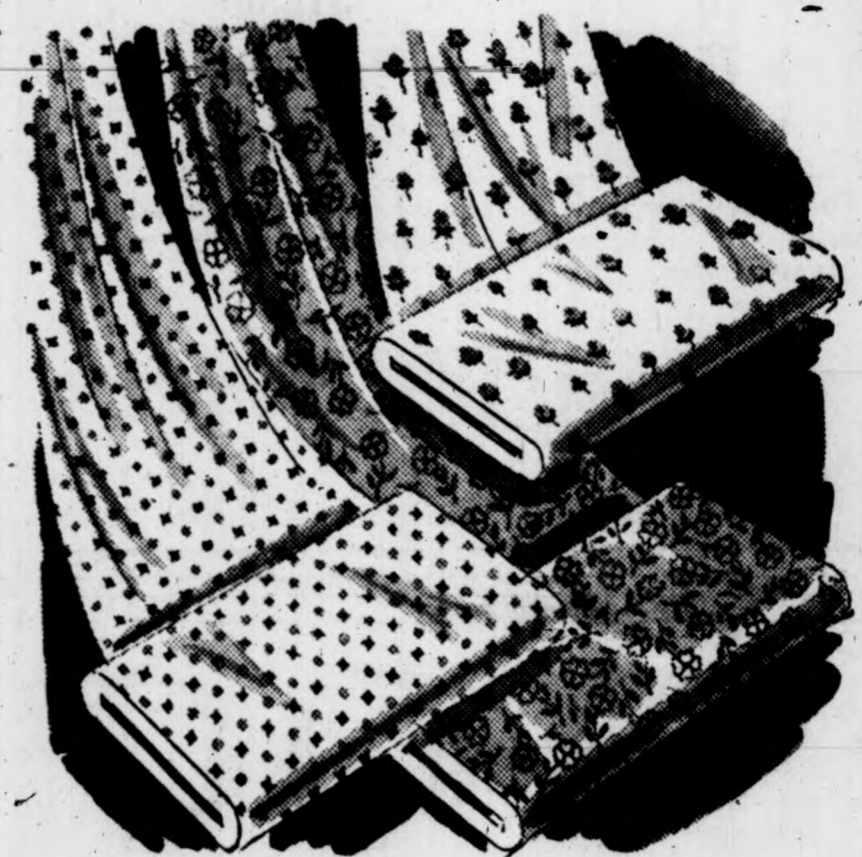
