Woman Dies In Jail At Laurens

Laurens—A 36-year-old Columbia woman was found dead in the Laurens County jail early Saturday morning.

County Jailor Tom Williams said that Mrs. Mary Ester Clayton was dead when he entered her cell at 7:15 a. m. with her breakfast. Sheriff C. W. Wier said the woman was arrested by deputies Friday at 1:10 a. m. and jailed on a charge of drunkenness.

An autopsy was ordered performed at Greenville General hospital. A report is expected by Monday, the sheriff said.

She was the only prisoner in the woman's section of the jail, according to the jailor.

Mr. Williams said she refused her supper Friday night, but drank a soft drink which she requested.

The jailor said he heard noises in the woman's section of the jail about 10:30 p. m., went to investigate and found the woman on the floor. He said that two maids put her to bed and that he later checked the cell and talked with the woman. She apparently was all right at the time, he said.

He said he heard no more noise during the night.

When he went to her cell Saturday morning, he said, she was stretched across another cot with her feet on the floor.

Magistrate Lucille M. Watts, acting coroner, empaneled a jury and viewed the body at the jail.

Bozard Is Dean At Appalachian State

Dr. John F. Bozard, since 1957 a member of the faculty at Appalachian State Teachers College, has been named as the college's first Dean of Instruction. He took over his duties on March 1.

He will continue to devote a considerable portion of his time to the teaching of English, as he has been doing. He is a professor in the Department of English.

Dr. Bozard holds the bachelor of arts degree from Furman University, the master of arts degree from the University of Virginia, and the doctor of philosophy degree from Cornell University.

A native of Orangeburg, Dr. Bo-

zard once served as principal of Clinton High School and headed the Cross Hill school for one year. He was professor of English and assistant dean at Furman University, Greenville, from 1929 to 1939, and was dean and head of the English department at Limestone College from 1939 to 1948.

His wife is the former Miss Elise Henry, daughter of H. D. Henry and the late Mrs. Henry of Clinton.
