

## Easter Carolina League Is Formed With 6 Teams

The old Eastern Carolina League was restored to life for the 1960 baseball season at a meeting here Thursday night, with six teams being accepted.

Clinton, Buffalo of Union, Carlisle, Riverdale of Ennore, Draper and Kohler of Spartanburg are members.

Plans call for a 30-game schedule to begin Tuesday night, April 26. They'll play on Tuesday and Saturday nights. Play is to be suspended the Fourth of July vacation week.

Claude Crocker was named president. W. D. (Bill) Terry is secretary-treasurer. Crocker, once a pitcher in the Dodgers' ranks when they performed in Ebbetts Field, Brooklyn, is the guiding hand behind the Eastern Carolina.

A righthander, Crocker joined Clinton in the fast Central Carolina League in the late 1940's after leaving the Dodger organization. He pitched several seasons with Clinton before hanging up the spikes. He is director of industrial relations at Clinton Cotton Mills.
