Work has already started on the Pony field to put it into top shape before the season starts. Top soil will be put on this field and the Little Boys field as soon as the weather permits. Both of these fields need a good bit of grading which the city has agreed to do, provided the weather cooperates.

The City of Clinton has promised to help light the Pony field which will also be used for a soft ball field. In the next few days, you as a soft ball player or soft ball enthusiast may be approached by someone to make a donation to help with the lighting of this field. All donations will go toward having a well-lighted field that you will be proud of.

All boys not born before August 1, 1947, are eligible to try out for the Little Boys baseball teams. Boys not born before August 1, 1945, are eligible to try out for the Pony teams. Boys not born before August 1, 1949, may try out for Small Fry teams. All of the Small Fry coaches have not been selected at this date but those at Hampton School wanting to try out for Small Fry will see Wilmot Shealy, those at Bailey School will see Truman Owens, and those at Joanna will see Johnny Moore.
