### Harold W. Tyler Dies After Boarding Bus; Funeral Held Here

A 55-year-old man, Harold W. Tyler, suffered an attack while traveling on a bus he had boarded at Clinton and was pronounced dead on arrival at the Newberry County hospital Sunday night.

Coroner George R. Sumner said Mr. Tyler apparently died of natural causes and no inquest will be held. The coroner said the man was carrying a note that he had seven children at a children's home. He had been there on a visit.

The driver of the bus, due to arrive at Newberry at 8:10 p. m., drove his vehicle to the hospital where a physician pronounced Mr. Tyler dead.

The coroner said a driver's permit carried by the victim listed his home address as Marion.

The body was returned to Clinton and funeral services were conducted at 3:30 p. m. at Thornwell Memorial Presbyterian Church by Dr. Malcolm A. Macdonald. Burial was in Rosemont cemetery.

### Negro Dies By Own Act When Hit By Train Jury Decides

Laurens—A coroner's jury found Friday night that Willie C. Lattimore, Jr., came to his death by being struck by an Atlantic Coast Line train and death was due to his own carelessness.

The 21-year-old Negro was hit Wednesday shortly after noon as he sat astride the tracks in the Cold Point community six miles south of Laurens.

Magistrate Lucille Watts, acting coroner, conducted the inquest at the court house here.

Thomas Babb, Laurens attorney, questioned three witnesses, J. H. Lyons, engineer of the train; R. W. Groves, fireman; and sheriff's deputy, Wallace Abercrombie.

The fireman and the engineer testified the train was traveling the maximum speed for that area, 49 mph, when an object was spotted on the track.

Both said the train horn and bell were sounded when the object appeared to be a man, emergency brakes were applied and the throttle was shut off, they said.

Fireman Groves said he moved out of the door of the locomotive and to the front of the engine. He said the man looked back but made no effort to move from the rails.

The deputy said the body was carried 57 feet from the impact point.
