Synod to Learn of \$10 Million Goal For Presbyterian College

Presbyterian College has been given a special place on the docket of the Synod of South Carolina when it meets next week in the First (Scots) Presbyterian Church in Charleston. The first business following the opening devotional and organization of synod will be the special program at 11:30 Tuesday morning, on the survey and needs of Presbyterian College.

A group of educators in 1957 made a survey of the work and needs of the college, recommending that the facilities be expanded to care for 900 students, and that the co-educational feature of the college be developed. Presbyterian College's president, Dr. Marshall W. Brown, will be in charge of the program at synod, which will explain in detail the need for the college's expansion program. The over-all goal provides for the addition of \$6,000,000 in endowment, and \$4,000,000 in capital improvements.
