Registration for classes will begin Monday at 2:00 p. m. and continue until 5 o'clock on Bailey porch. No attendance at any class will be permitted without registration. Night meetings which begin each evening at 7:30, will be open to the public.

Mrs. J. Melvin Thompson, Synodical President, will act as Dean of the school, and Mrs. G. B. Sheppard will serve as director. The theme for the week will be "Understanding the Bible." Courses to be taught, and the instructors, are: "How To Study the Bible," Dr. Joseph Gettys, Presbyterian College; "Christian Witnessing," Dr. C. Newman Faulconer, First Presbyterian Church, Greenville; "Church Extension, in the Home," Claude H. Pritchard, Board of Church Extension, Atlanta, Ga.; "Informal Ways of Learning," Mrs. James W.
