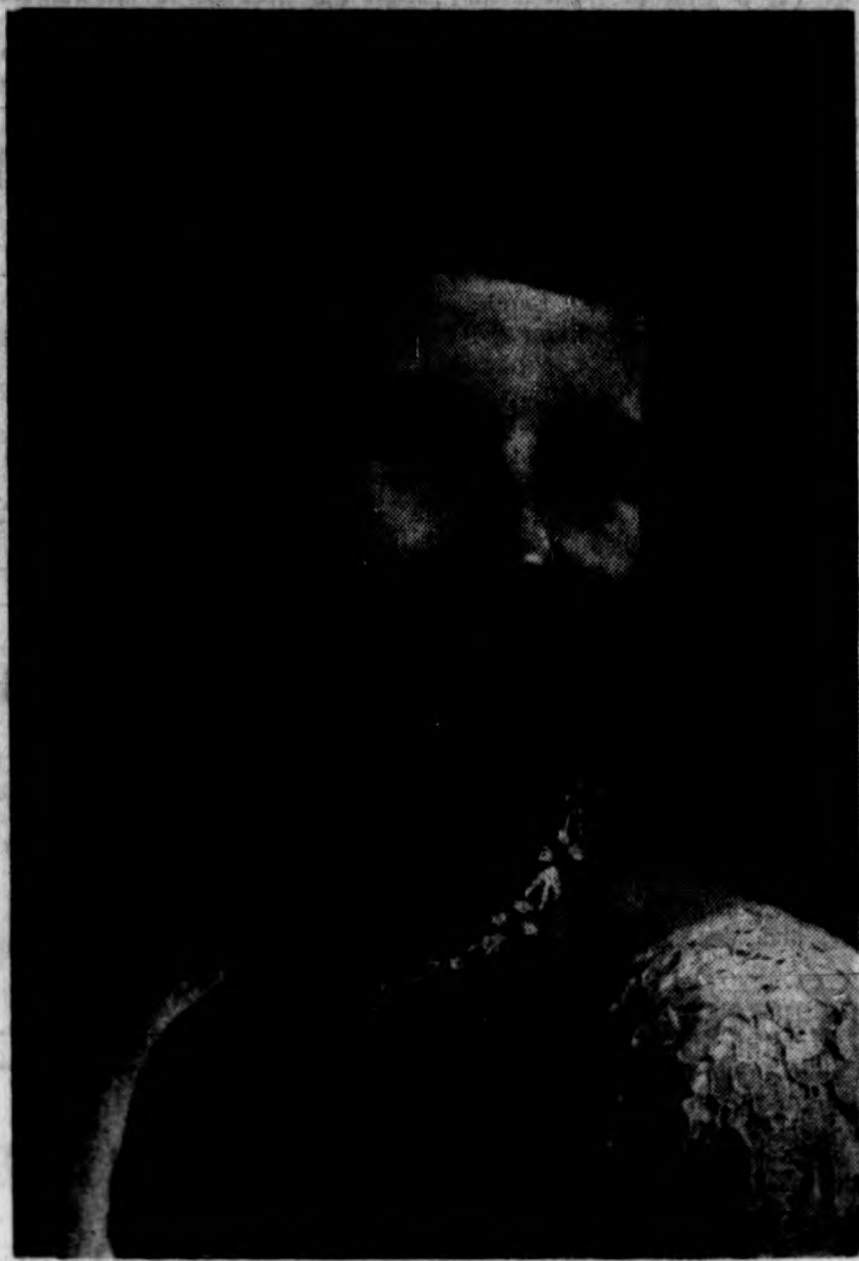
The Rev. J. H. Darr, church pastor, officiated, using the double ring ceremony.
