Billy DeShields of Lanford Station, has 25 acres of cotton that tops all I've seen. He got an early stand and has had a few showers along to keep it growing. But he is having problems with the boll worm. The boll worm always attacks the best cotton. Cotton growers who have this insect should apply the proper insecticide in proper amounts and make sure the wind doesn't blow it away.

L. Chapman and W. T. Miller of Mountville had cotton damaged by scald. This usually happens to badly wilted cotton that receives a quick rain and the sun comes out just after the rain.

A. T. Stewart of Lanford Station has worked 60 acres of cotton all by himself. He hired only \$160.00 worth of help. Mr. Stewart used the pre-

Gentlemen, smut in barley can be controlled. Demonstrations all over the state proved this last season. A. A. Ramage, Jr., of the Hopwell community, and John Simmons of Mountville, each had a demonstration that proved 100 per cent effective. The barley is soaked in water for a period of time. It is then sealed in 50-gallon drums for a period and then taken out and dried. The only equipment needed is 50-gallon drums and water.
