Clinton Production Credit Assn. Reports \$523,370 In Loans

The mid-year report of the Clinton Production Credit Association shows current loans to members to be \$523,370.

The report, issued by the board of directors for mailing to the 890 members this week, lists the net worth of the co-op credit association as \$137,249.

Nine new members were added during the first six months of the year, according to the report, which also states that 137 loans were obtained by members during the period, for a total of \$317,180.

Earnings for the period were given as \$1,422 above operating costs. Total member-owned stock outstanding is \$58,645, with accumulated earnings of \$78,604.

The report is signed by Hugh B. Workman, Claude L. Lester, Lawrence F. Davis, R. N. Jackson, and David C. Waldrop, directors. Mr. Jackson died Sunday at his home near Gray Court.

J. M. Bedenbaugh of Silvestree, is secretary-treasurer and managing officer of the association.

County Dairymen Buy 82 Holsteins

Eighty-two head of cattle were sold last Tuesday at the Laurens County Cooperative Breeding Association's southeastern "Show Window" Holstein cattle sale at the Laurens County fair grounds.

The Ohio-bred cattle from 46 Ohio breeders netted a total of \$32915. The average price per head was \$409.00.

White Plains Farm of Laurens County paid the highest price, \$650, for a heifer. Ola Forbes is manager of the farm and W. Jack Greer, president-treasurer of Texize Chemicals, Inc., of Greenville, is owner. The sale was a joint effort of the cooperatives in South Carolina and Ohio. C. G. Cushman, Clemson College extension dairy leader, said that 21 counties in South Carolina are serviced by the Ohio Breeding association. H. L. Wickham is president of the Laurens Breeding Association.

A parade of the sale cattle took place Monday at 6:30 p. m. at the fair grounds and was followed by a barbecue supper. The parade was held to give prospective buyers a view of the cattle before the sale.

About 200 persons attended the sale, according to County Agent M. L. Outz.

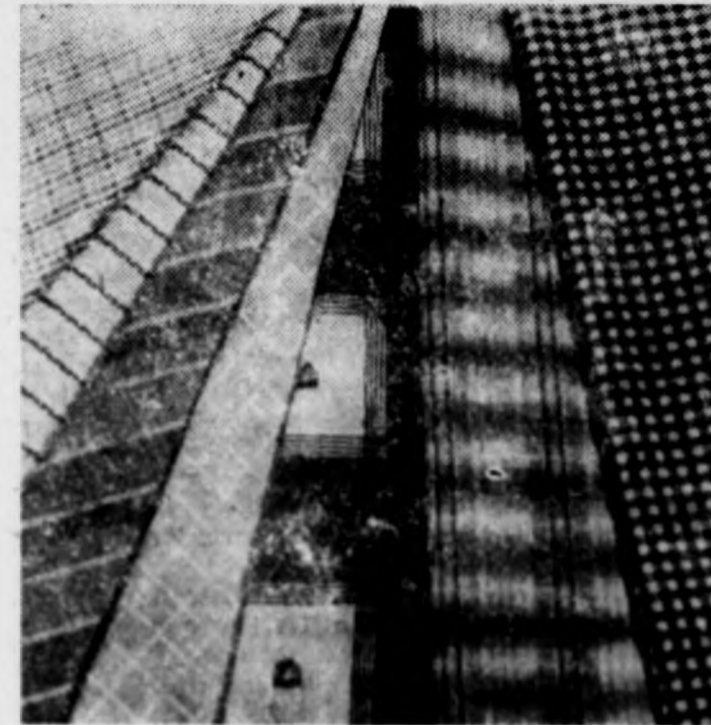
