**Give The United Way**

**SOUTH CAROLINA MENTAL HEALTH ASSOCIATION**

The South Carolina Mental Health Association, which participates in the Clinton Community Chest, as an agency in the Carolina's United Group, is rapidly increasing its program of services to the mentally ill, and intensifying its fight against mental illness.

Organized as a division of the National Association for Mental Health six years ago, SCMHA is dedicated to the total fight against mental illness, and is active in all phases of the over-all Mental Health problem. The association now has seventeen affiliated County Mental Health Chapters, and is organizing others throughout the state.

Harry R. Bryan of Columbia, executive director of SCMHA, points with pride to the part his organization played in bringing about legislation favorable to mental health during the last term of the South Carolina General Assembly. The most notable forward steps taken by the legislature were the increase in the operating budget of the South Carolina State Hospital for approximately a million dollars for the current fiscal year, and an appropriation to establish the sixth Mental Health Clinic in the state, to serve the counties of York, Chester, and Lancaster.

The association already has active committees studying and working towards the solution of the problems of emotionally disturbed children in South Carolina, the problem of the mentally ill being retained in jails in South Carolina, and the problems met by former mental patients returning to communities in our state. A fourth important special committee is now being set up to work in the area of careers in Mental Health.

Workshops on careers in Mental Health and the social rehabilitation of discharged mental patients will be featured at SCMHA's seventh annual meeting in Columbia on November 3, along with a third workshop on "Community Mental Health."
