Reckless Homicide Is Charge In Crash When Youth Killed

Laurens. — A truck driver was quoted here Saturday as saying he never saw the car with which his vehicle collided, resulting in the death of a 17-year-old boy of Clinton, Rt. 1.

An inquest jury empaneled by Coroner Marshall Pressley found Saturday that Teague's death was caused by a car-truck wreck, and identified Parks as driver of the truck.

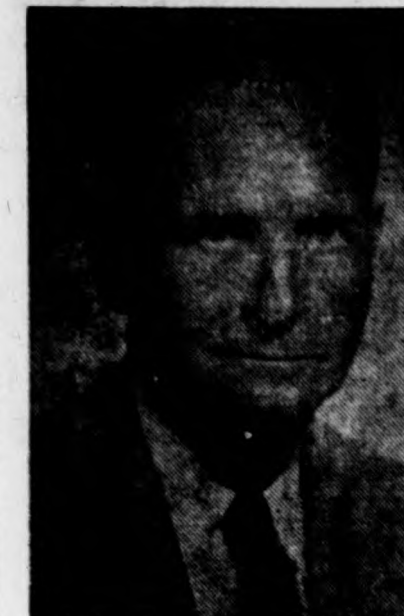
The car was struck from the rear by a two-ton 1959 Ford truck, owned by Southern Cotton Oil Division of Spartanburg, the captain said.
