**Sease Commander Of Co. A At P. C.**  
James William Sease of this city, is a cadet officer in Presbyterian College's highly ranked ROTC unit, which stands as one of the oldest in the nation.

The son of Mrs. T. M. Sease of 314 North Adair Street, he serves as commander of Company A with the rank of cadet first lieutenant. He is a senior majoring in chemistry.

The Presbyterian College ROTC unit was first established in 1919, shortly after Congress inaugurated this program of college military training. It has compiled an outstanding record through the years and only last summer ranked fifth among 36 universities and colleges competing in the Third Army summer camp activities at Fort Benning, Ga.

Now tailored as a battle group to conform with the Army's new table of organization, the Presbyterian unit's present roll of 310 cadets is the largest in its 41-year history at PC.

Under the ROTC program, all students take the first two years of military training. Certain cadets then are selected for advanced study during their junior and senior years, a course which leads to a commission as second lieutenant in the Officers' Reserve Corps upon graduation.
