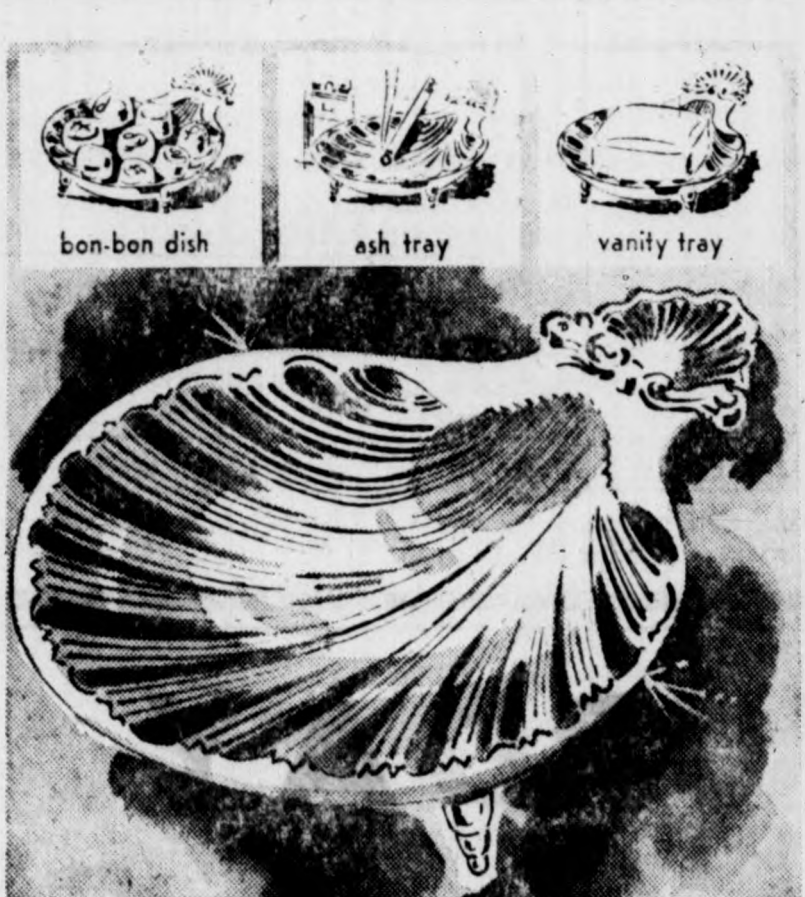
Fraternity Entertains For Parents Day
