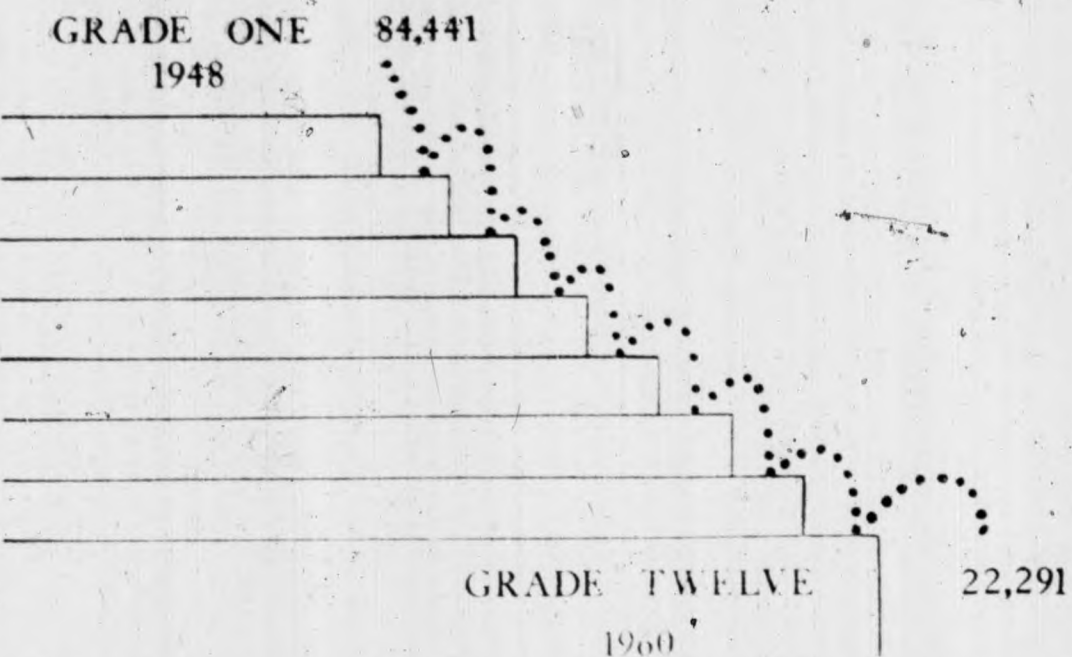

**SOUTH CAROLINA SCHOOL DROPOUTS**



Only a fourth of the pupils who enter South Carolina schools are finishing high school 12 years later, according to H. A. Lynch, president of the Laurens County Education Association.

"The tragic loss in education, in earning power and in their ability to become good citizens must be stopped," the president said.

Of the 84,441 children who entered the first grade in 1948, only 22,291 were graduated last summer.

While exact figures on the district level are not now available, the president said that when there is a good school program, guidance services, vocational program, modern teaching devices and qualified teachers and facilities, there is less "fall outs" among the students.

The local president said that these services "cost money, but the money is one of the greatest investments South Carolina can make since there is a direct relationship between the number of grades completed and the amount of money a person earns."

Parents, teachers and the community itself all have a stake in keeping children in school just as long as they can profit from a school program, the president said.
