Laurens By-Pass Contract Awarded

A contract has been awarded to construct and pave 3.5 miles of a new by-pass around Laurens, it was announced last week by the State Highway Department.

Designated as S. C. 127, the route will extend from U. S. 221 (Laurens-Greenwood road) to U. S. 76 (Laurens-Clinton road). It will join the Clinton road near the county fair grounds.

When the by-pass was proposed several months ago it met with strong opposition at a hearing held in Laurens.

Satterfield Construction Co., Greenwood, was awarded the contract on a low bid of \$304,151.

Forest Fire Losses In State Increase

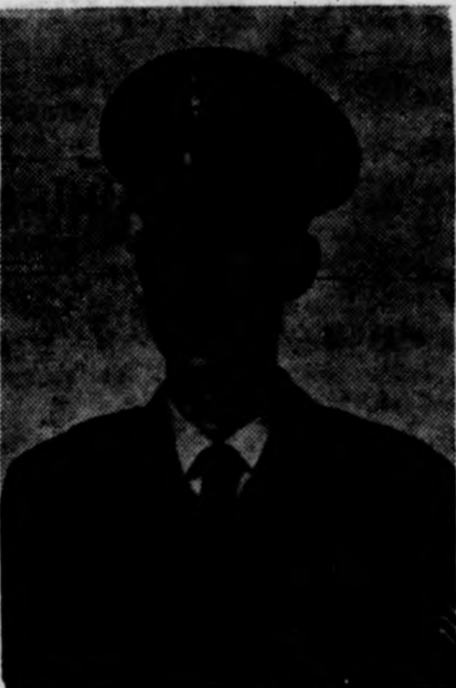
Forest fire losses more than doubled in South Carolina during December, as 762 fires burned 6,996 acres of woodland.

During November 274 fires burned 1,580 acres.

Below normal rainfall in December contributed to increased forest fire hazards and losses, according to State Forester Charles H. Flory.

In Laurens County, December chalked up 7 fires and 34.6 acres burned. In the six months period ending on December 31, 1962, 21 fires in Laurens County had burned 90.9 acres. There have been three convictions during that period.

State Forester Flory has urged all South Carolinians to exercise care and caution during the coming winter and spring months, when the most severe forest fire losses occur in South Carolina.
