Question — What causes

my iron to stick to the

clothing as I press it? Answer - Either too much s'arch, clothes not properly rinsed, or dirt on the bottom of your 'ron can cause this. If it's the bottom of your iron that's at fault, rub it with a damp cloth when cool. Polish wih a dry cloth. For stubborn cases, use silver polish, or run the iron over a litt'e table salt spread on waxed paper. In the case of rayons and other synthetic fabrics,






