DEAF MUTE FALLS IN LAW'S GRASP

Alleged to Have Been Connected With Robbery in Camden

He was both deaf and dumb and was ignorant of English and officers who arrested him were in a quandary as to what his name was. It was John Morton Nell of Habana, Cuba, according to an identification paper found in his pockets inside a weather beaten memorandum book, which he had used to try to write English in, but most of it resembled a cross between Chinese and Russian.

Nell was arrested late last night by Detectives Shorter, Knox, Allen and Val Smyrl, special agent of the Atlantic Coast Line railroad, on the 709 block of Pendleton street in connection with a robbery of a residence in Camden Saturday night. Yesterday the sheriff of Camden came over to Columbia seeking a deaf and dumb man thought to have engineered the robbery. Last night Columbia detectives got on the trail and shortly Nell was in the hands of the law and was carried to jail. The detectives were warned beforehand that Nell was a bad character and took no chances in arresting him.

Two pistols were found in his possession and also two suitcases of goods, said to have been stolen in Camden, and also a portable talking machine.

Nell is several inches over six feet high and can only try to talk with his hands and even at that knows very little English if any at all.

He is held for investigation pending the arrival of officers from Camden to take him over there on the robbery charge.—The State.

This fellow "operated" in Camden recently. We understand that he robbed one or two negro houses. He may be a Cuban but he looks very much like a negro, and our impression of him was that he is a fraud pure and simple. We may be mistaken, but do not believe that he is deaf and dumb, but is only pretending to be. At any rate he looks like he could make a useful hand on the chain gang.

CLEMSON COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP EXAMINATION

Competitive examinations for the award of vacant scholarships in Clemson College will be held on Friday, July 12, 1929, beginning at 9 A. M. by each County Superintendent of Education. These scholarships will be open to young men sixteen years of age or over, who desire to pursue courses in Agriculture or Textiles. Scholarships are awarded by the State Board of Education on the recommendation of the State Board of Public Welfare.

These examinations include English, Algebra, Geometry, and History and are based on the State High School curriculum. Applicants for Agricultural Scholarships are also examined on Agriculture.

Persons interested should write the Registrar for information and application blanks before the time of the examinations. Successful applicants must meet fully the requirements for admission.

Each scholarship is worth \$100.00 and free tuition, which is \$40.00 additional. Scholarships are open only to residents of South Carolina.

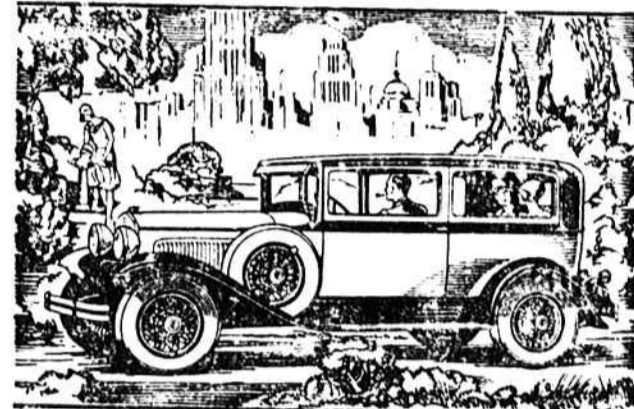
