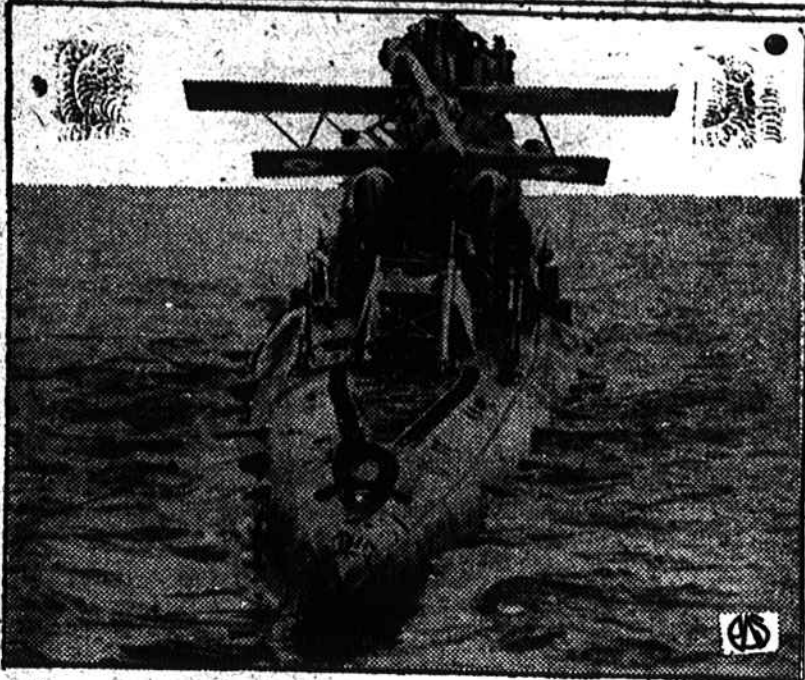


British Submarine Lost in Channel
