The Primary Ticket

The committee on printing appointed by the county executive committee, met at the Opera House on Monday to arrange for printing tickets for the primary election. The time for filing pledges by candidates has expired, so that no other names can be added. Below is given a complete list of candidates whose names appear on the ticket.

In voting, be sure and follow the rules; scratching otherwise your vote for the office incorrectly scratched will not be counted. If you do not care to vote for any candidate for one office, scratch the whole list of names for that office and the balance of your ticket will count if correctly scratched. The following points in reference to scratching will be of use.

There are twelve candidates for delegates to the state convention and six to be elected; scratch six names and leave six.

There is one congressman to be elected and two candidates; scratch one name and leave one.

There are three candidates for solicitor and one to be elected; scratch two names and leave one.

For the House of Representatives there are seven candidates and two to be elected; scratch five names and leave two.

For sheriff there are five candidates; scratch all the names except one.

There are four candidates for clerk of the court; scratch three names and leave one.

There are seven candidates for county commissioner and three to be elected; scratch four names and leave three.

There are two candidates for coroner; scratch one and leave the other.

For school commissioner there are three candidates; scratch two names and leave one.

For auditor and treasurer there is only one candidate for each office.

As to trial justices, each township will elect its own. In De Kalb, Buffalo and Wateree townships, there are two candidates and one to be elected. Voters in those townships will scratch the names of all except one of the two in their particular townships. In Flat Rock township there are four candidates and two to be elected. Voters in that township will scratch all names except two of the four names for their township.

See that your ticket is not torn or mutilated in any way; be certain that it is properly scratched if you wish your vote to count.
