We have before us the first number of The County Banner published at Florence, S. C., by H. L. Darr. The Banner was formerly published at Bishopville but of course a paper cannot be published there, and Mr. Darr sought a better field in Florence. Secretary Walter Q. Gresham died last Tuesday morning. He was for fourteen years United States District Judge for Indiana and for eight years United States Circuit Judge for Illinois, and held three cabinet portfolios, Postmaster General and Secretary of the Treasury under Arthur, and Secretary of State Under Cleveland.

Where The Trouble Lies.

Why do producers suffer for the want of food and clothing when their labor supplies an abundance of both? Their labor supplies sufficient material to feed and clothe all the people, yet they suffer for the lack of both, starvation and nakedness among wealth producers is surely an anomalous condition. What has produced this condition? Falling prices of labor products. Tariff taxes levied, not for revenue, but to increase the income of millionaires by forced contributions from the poorer classes. How are the poor forced to contribute to the income of the rich? A tariff tax is levied on foreign goods to prevent them from competing in prices with the factories in which the millionaire invests his money. The poor are charged 50 per cent more for the goods that they are thus compelled to buy from these monopolists. In this way millions of dollars are annually forced from the daily earnings of labor to increase the income of millionaires. These robbers and their allies do not perceive that their course will impoverish the farmers and mechanics (the producers of wealth) and in the end stop their own income by destroying the source from which it comes. The money factories and railroads in which the funds of the millionaire are invested, depend on the patronage of the farmers for their profits. If the farmers and mechanics organized by millionaires depress the prices of goods the farmers buy, and financial legislation enacted by capitalists or millionaires depresses the prices of what the farmers sell, then there is no profit in farming. Less freight patronage for railroads, less employment for mechanics and mill operatives, less income for the farmer depends on the success of all other classes. Without them millionaires would starve and be a good riddance to society if no other class suffered by this mode of their extermination. Three fifths of the manufactured goods are consumed by the agriculturists, and about one fifth by mechanics and mill operatives. Their ability to consume depends on farmers' profits. Farmers furnish the bulk of rail road freight. When agriculture is depressed rail roads go into the hands of "receivers." Fires die out in factory furnaces, employees are discharged and become tramps, instead of wealth producers. The depressed condition

of farmers is in part the result of reducing the volume of money of fluid redemption (metallic money) one half by demonetization silver, and thereby reducing prices of labor products one half, and doubling the prices of debts, salaries and taxes. This with the protective tariff and its legitimate offspring combines and trusts is the cause of the farmers' depression. And is the means used for his oppression. In 1872 the price of silver was \$1.34 per ounce, cotton 12 cents a pound, and wheat \$1.47 a bushel. In 1891 silver was 65 cents, cotton 6 cents and wheat 57 cents, cotton and wheat went down with silver. The danger confronting us is the aggregation of wealth in the hands of the few, and the impoverishment of the masses by unjust laws dictated by the money power.
