The Situation.
The situation that now confronts the true Democrats of South Carolina is indeed a very serious one. It is now certain that the Republicans are going to put out a ticket in every county in the State to be voted for in the election of delegates to the Constitutional Convention. Who the Republican candidates in Kershaw county will be is not known, but certain it is that a ticket will be put out, and Democrats had as well prepare for the fight at once. The Republicans are thoroughly organized and every white man who has the interest of the State at heart should arouse himself and see to it that no Democrat stays from the polls on election day, or the probabilities are that Kershaw county will be represented in the Constitutional Convention by negroes and white Republican. Injunction Refused.
In the United States Circuit Court last Tuesday morning, Judge Goff handed down a brief in the South Carolina registration case, dismissing the bill for an injunction. The opinion created some surprise, as it was exactly opposite to the opinion rendered by Judge Goff in the Mills case, involving the same questions. This of course is a complete victory for the State, however, an appeal will be made by Attorney O'bear, who thinks he can get an early hearing as a privileged case. It is hardly possible though that the case can be heard before October, and by

that time the Convention will have met and commenced its work. Speaking of this action, the Columbia Register says: "Who'd have thought it? Judge Goff actually refused the injunction prayed for against Supervisor of Registration Green, and dismissed the bill. Nobody in South Carolina was worrying over Goff's possible action in this case. The news of Gowdy's suit for an injunction did not cause a ripple of excitement in South Carolina. But the news that Goff refused the injunction prayed for will be received with surprise. Everybody expected him to grant the injunction because of his self-acknowledged prejudice in favor of unrestricted negro suffrage. In making his decision in the first case deciding the registration law unconstitutional, Goff announced with considerable uncton that he was happy because the desires and judgment of the court coincided. It would not have made any difference had Judge Goff issued the injunction against delivery of the books by Supervisor Green, for Governor Evans had everything arranged to beat Judge Goff at his own game and would have amply protected South Carolina's best interests. In view of the decision of the Circuit Court of Appeals up setting his decision declaring the registration law unconstitutional only pure "bull-headedness" could have led Goff to again declare that law unconstitutional. It seems that the lesson taught him was not without effect."
