About Cotton Ties

Colonel D. P. Duncan, manager of the State Alliance Exchange went to New York Saturday to push the fight he is waging on behalf of Southern farmers against the Cotton Tie Trust which seeks to extort from them this year twice as much as they paid last year for hoop ties and will probably further advance their prices if it finds it has the farmers at its mercy and can squeeze them at will.

Colonel Duncan is thoroughly in earnest and wants to whip and crush the Trust now and for all time to come. He has won the first battle of the war by finding a substitute for the hoop ties which is satisfactory to the cotton factors and will be received at the companies.

The suitability of the substitute was perfectly demonstrated by a satisfactory test at the Champion Cotton Press in Charleston. The Charleston cotton factors have announced that they will receive orders of cotton bound with wire ties. All that is need now is to find some wire factories which will produce wire ties in sufficient quantities to meet the needs of the Southern farmers.

The Cotton Crop

The latest reports by wire from the Southwest say that the weather is still very dry and hot. The wires bring us every day hundreds of requests for our opinion as to the probable course of the market. With every disposition to give our friends the best information we can gather it is difficult to state the situation in a brief telegram without danger of misleading them.

We have decided opinions as to how prices will be two or three months hence. There is no longer any possibility of the monster crop which seemed probable six weeks ago. We feel sure that the yield will be only a very moderate one, and that as soon as the trade shall become satisfied of this fact a quick and material and lasting advance will follow.

Buy up on breaks, but not more than you can easily protect. 3. For the present accept moderate profits, so as to be ready to lay again on a decline.
