There are both rings and pendants, and they are made in quite a number of forms, but all of them have just as light a setting as is consistent with the safe fastening of the stones. The jewels are attached to the nails by a screw arrangement such as is often used for diamond carrings. The nalls do not have to be especially long. but great care must be taken in perforating them, and that is an operation which is usually left to a manieure. New holes must be made every week or two, and the more common practice is to transfer the gems from one finger to another whenever a new hole must be made. When rings are used instead of pendants, they are usually only about half the diameter of the ordinary finger ring, and are studded all around with very small stones.


