Paper Read by Dr. J. P. Richards Before the Farmers' Institute on Last Monday.

Mr. President and Gentlemen of the Kershaw County Farmers' Institute—It is with some embarrassment that I appear before you today, to speak upon a subject of such acknowledged importance...

The subject of this paper is the application of manures and it is a question of great breadth that it requires one of greater research and far more experience than I have had...

As this is an almost inexhaustible subject, as broad as the universe, I have thought it wise to condense matters, discussing the application of some few of the more important manures...

Now I know that there are some present who are ready to say, that there had better be discussion upon the application of manures to any other crop...

The time has past and gone, when it pays any one in this country to plant on the extensive plan. We will readily agree I presume, that the only possible hope for success in the production of any crop...

This brings us up directly to the discussion of the application of manures to the cotton crop. In the cultivation of cotton in order to get the greatest yield...

The plant must have Nitrogen, Phosphoric Acid and Potash and after we have decided upon a manure that will furnish these three necessities in the right proportion...

Now in the discussion of this question, we very naturally will have to consider first, when or at what stage in the handling of the crop we are to apply our manures...

A light sandy, porous soil does not produce well, if manures are applied in the same manner as is customary to apply them to a stiff clay soil.

Now to discuss this question intelligently let us take the application of a certain manure for consideration. And as stable manure comes nearest being a perfect manure...

Let us know the character of our soil, its chemical analysis and then we can more intelligently determine when and how to apply our manures...

Thanking you, Mr. President and gentlemen for the attention given me, and hoping that I may have said something that may arouse an interesting and instructive discussion...
