PROVISIONS OF THE BILL

ach County to Have Commissioners Their Remuneration and Duties - Duties of Township Boards of Commissioners Trans ferred to Township Boards of Assessors.

The following is the county governnent bill as prepared by Senators Lavingston, Graydon and Glenn, and Representatives W. J. Johnson, Biythe. Jonkins, Dargan and Hydrick. The bill with all the Sonate amendments was adopted by the House without

Section 1. That an act entitled "An net to provide for the county govern ment of the various courses of this State," be, and the same is hereby, reenacted and amended so as to read a

Section 1. That there shall be in each of the counties of this State a county board of commissioners, which shall be composed of the county supervisor, who shall be elected and hand office, as now provided by law, and two commisloners, who shall be appointed by the governor upon the recommendation of he members of the general assembly from the several countries or a majority of them, and whose term of office shall be coterminal with that of the supervisor with whom they are appointed to serve, and until their successors shall be appointed and qualified. Said commission ers shall be commissioned by the secrelary of state, as other county officers, but without charge for their commis stons: Provided, that in Pickens county the supervisor and the said commisstoners shall each give bond in the sum f \$2,000 after the year 1900. Provided, further, That in Sumfer county six commissioners shall be appointed as aforesaid, who, with the county supervisor, shall constitute the county board of communicationers in said county vided, further, That in Richland county one commissioner shall be elected in each township by the qualified electors thereof at the next general election, and every two years thereafter, and they shall hold office for two years from election, and until their success as shall be elected and qualified.

Provided, further, by the county of York, there shall be appointed by the governor, upon the recommendation of the delegation in the general assembly. three discreet persons in each town mp, one of whom shall be chairman of the township board of commissioners, and he shall attend the meetings of the county board of commissioners at least quarterly, and shall receive \$15 per an num, payable quarterly, for such at lendance, and the said township beard hall be the township assessors for their respective townships, and be paid the per diem and mileage herein pro-

Sec. 2. That said board shall meet at the county seal at stated times, once in each month, for the transaction of bus mess, and a majority shall constitute i prorum. The county supervisor shall be chairman of said board.

Sec. 5. That said county board of commissioners shall, in their several and respective counties, have and exercise all the jurisdiction, powers and duties heretofore devolved b the county supervisors, the county boards of commissioners and the township boards of commissioners, under the provisions of the laws heretofore existing, providing for a system of county government for the various counties of the State: Provided, That no claim against the county shall be paid until it shall have been approved in writing by a majority of said beard

Buring the first few years there will not be many killed, as it is the intention to increase the flock to at least 2,000, -Some farming will have to be done as an adjunct to the sheep raising. All the feed nec essary to carry the sheep during the Winter is to be raised on the ranch. Large barns will be built for the protection of the stock, and also for storing bay and grain. 

History of Three Man Cages. As a finishing touch to the rebuilding of the Lambertus Church in Munster, Westphalia, the three "manhigh" iron cages that hung from its great tower since 1637 have Deen heisted anew to a height of 325 feet in accordance with the sentence of

the ancient Bishop's Court: "And there, on the highest point he Munsterland, they shall hang for ever and ever, as a warning to evil-doers from now on till judgment day."

These cages were both the prisons and coffins of the renounced Anabaptists, John Van Leyden, self styled "King of the Universe." his Chancelr. Kretching, and his Governor and Lord High Executioner, Knipperdolling. The cages just heisted were remade from the originals, when the latter were taken down a year ago to allow of the rebuilding of the tower, They were then in a dilapidated condition, rust having caten away part of the framework. The new cages, although strict copies of the original, are somewhat smaller, but they contain the books and fetlocks with which their unfortunate tenants were bound and tortured while being carried around Westphalia to be exhibited to the public and tortured by such persons as cared to pay the fees exdeted for the privilege. It cost a penny to stick a dagger into one of the doomed men's legs, while for three pence the King might be burned

with a hot poker. In the cages, when they were taken down, were two skulls, a broken and a battered leg bone and odd pieces of ribs and fingers. One of the chaff was identified as that of the King by An iron crown fastened to the head by spikes. The instruments of torture, including rusty daggers, big nails and pincers, were in good state of preser-
