A series of experiments whi have been carried on for some, tin past by the agricultural department have recently developed n new ufor corn stalks, from which a ve valuable horse and cattle food co be made. The department has do a great work with corn stalks in th past year and has developed sever uses for them, namely : Coffer da packing for warships, a high wran of writing paper, the basis for smokeless powder, superior to the pieric acid powders, and several of er uses. The new cattle food made by grinding the dry cor stalks, leaves and tops, to a powde and mixing it with blood or molass. or both. This is pressed into cak under a bydraulic press and can b shipped as easily as bricks or corwood. For feeding it is broken in and mixed up with water.
