An Ordinance TO PROHIBIT THE SALE OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS.

Be it ordained by the City Council of Camden, S. C., that from and after the passage of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful to manufacture, sell, barter, exchange or keep for unlawful use within the city of Camden any spirituous, malt, fermented, brewed or other liquor or any mixture or compound which contains alcohol and used as a beverage; provided, that this ordinance and the enforcement thereof shall in no way conflict or interfere with any law or statute of the State of South Carolina regulating the sale of intoxicating liquors.

That any person who shall violate the terms of this ordinance shall on conviction thereof be fined in a sum not exceeding the sum of one hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or imprisoned for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days.

Enacted by the city council of Camden S. C. in regular session this 2nd day of February, 1903.

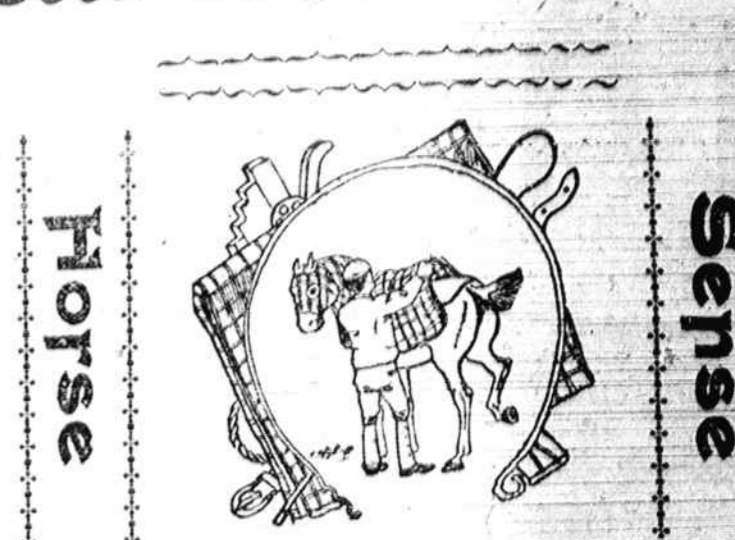
