VIOLATING THE LICENSE LAWS.

While we do not wish to be unjustly severe upon our northern friends, yet it is a fact that many of them after spending the winter here induce many of our best servants to return north with them. Within the past few weeks three or four car loads, we are informed, of colored people have left Camden for the north; some of R Thos Blackmon, them leaving their husbands and Anna S Holland, little children. This is working a considerable hardship upon some R C Dow, of our people, and at the same time DR Williams, those persons who do this are guilty Sadie Hathcock, of a misdemeanor punishable by W B Turner, quite a severe fine. The following W S Williams, is the law upon this subject:

"SEC. 608. No person shall carry Sadie Haithcock, on the business of an emigrant R C Dow, agent in this State without baving Anna S Holland, first obtained a license therefor from the State Treasurer. The term "emigrant agent" as contemplated in this section, shall be construed to mean any person engaged in hiring laborers or soliciting emigrants in this State to be employed beyond the limits of the same. Any person shall be entitled to a license, which shall be good for one year, upon payment into the State Treasury for the use of the State of Anna S Holland, five hundred dollars in each county J E Watkins, in which he operates or solicits emigrants.
