Conference of Cotton Producers Called.

We, the undersigned, having noticed the announced by the local cotton buyers that on and after October 20th, no cotton will be received with more than six yards of bagging and six ties, any excess bagging and ties will be docked two pounds per yard or tie. Regarding this action unjust, in view of the fact that many farmers have their cotton already baled, and are holding it to sell at such time as they may see proper, we urge the farmers of this and adjoining counties to meet at the Court House in Camden on Saturday, October 15th inst., to discuss this matter, and to take such action as they may deem proper. It seems to us that the farmers who produce the cotton should have some rights in this matter, and we especially urge them to attend the meeting to-morrow.

Thos. A. Banks vs. the So. Ex. Co. Verdict for the Plaintiff \$744. Defendants appealed.

The Charleston Savings Institution vs. the Farmers & Merchants Bank. This suit was brought to collect a note which was given by the DeKali Cotton Mill and endorsed by F. and M. Bank. The Court ordered a verdict for the Plaintiff for \$10,527.34.

The Gillis case will be heard to-morrow for a change of venue.


