Tax Returns.

Office of County Auditor,
Kershaw County,
Camden, S. C., Dec 3, 1904

Notice is hereby given that the Auditor's office for receiving State and County tax returns will be open from January 1st, 1905, to February 20th, 1905. (Sundays excepted.)

The dates of the appointments at which time the Auditor or his deputy will visit the usual places in the county for receiving returns are given below:

- Bethune, January 5.
- Raley's Mill, January 6.
- Kirkley's Store, January 7.
- Kershaw, January 9.
- Westville, January 10.
- Liberty Hill, January 11.
- Russell Place, January 12.
- Rabon's X Roads, January 13.
- Blaney, January 17.

IMPORTANT.

It is important that tax payers in making their returns be careful to state the school district—whether new or old—in which they reside at the time of making returns. Also to state if it is the same district as when last return was made.

WHO SHOULD MAKE RETURNS.

The law requires that all persons owning property or in anywise having charge of such property either as agent, husband, guardian, trustee, executor, administrator, &c., return the same under oath to the Auditor, who requests all persons to be prompt in making their returns and save the 50 per cent. penalty which will be added to the property valuation of all persons who fail to make returns within the time prescribed by law.

HOW AND WHAT TO RETURN.

All personal and real property owned on the 1st day of January, 1905, must be returned for taxation, and all changes or transfers of real estate noted.

All new buildings should be returned as "Real Property" acquired since last return.

INCOME TAX.

Under the recent Act of the Legislature all persons having a gross income of Twenty-five Hundred Dollars or more are required to make a return of the same to the Auditor at the time of making their other returns.

THE POLL TAX.

The new Constitution which went into full operation after the 31st of December, 1895, provides for a poll tax of One Dollar upon all citizens of this State between the ages of Twenty-One and Sixty years, excepting Confederate soldiers above the age of Fifty years. Parties making returns for the fiscal year 1905, will bear in mind this Constitutional provision and govern themselves accordingly.

All returns must be made on or before the 20th day of February next. I cannot take returns after that date as the other work of this office must go on. All returns made after the 20th of February are subject to the 50 per cent. penalty.

All returns sent by mail must be made out on proper blanks and sworn to before some proper officer to administer said oath, otherwise they will not be accepted at this office as returns.

The County Board of Equalization will meet at the office of the County Auditor on the 4th Tuesday of March, 1905, for the purpose of equalizing property, hearing complaints and protests.

TAX NOTICE.

Office of Treasurer of Kershaw County
Camden, S. C., Sept. 15, 1904.

In accordance with the Act to raise supplies for the fiscal year commencing January 1st, 1905, notice is hereby given that the books will be open for collecting State, county and school taxes from October 15, 1904, to March 1st, 1905. A penalty of 1 per cent will be added on all taxes unpaid by January 1st, 1905. A penalty of two per cent on all unpaid by Feb. 1st, 1905. A penalty of seven per cent will be added on all unpaid March 1st, 1905.

The rate per centum for Kershaw county is as follows:

The road tax of one dollar can be paid the County Treasurer from October 15th, 1904, to March 1st, 1905.

All male persons living within the corporate limits of cities or towns, students attending any college or school of the State, Ministers in charge of regular congregations, teachers employed in public schools, school trustees during their term of office, persons permanently disabled and those actually engaged in the quarantine service of the state are exempt from the payment of road tax. All other male persons between the ages of 18 and 60 years are required to pay said road tax or work not less than eight days during the year.

The poll tax is \$1. All information as to taxes will be furnished upon application.

No lists of names for tax receipts will be received unless the amount of tax money is deposited with the said list.

This rule will be strictly enforced.
