The Home Merchant.
 "What is the home merchant?" asks an exchange. He is a man who helps pay for the streets on which you walk; he helps to keep up the church in which you and yours worship; every subscription paper that is passed has his name upon it, he is the only one who cannot afford to swindle you, self interest if nothing else, would prevent this; he bears his share of the burden of local government and state with you in a way that is not darkness. Paste these instructions on his hat, and then stop and consider who gives you the things that you need for anything but your own loss.

Mr. J. E. Norman, a member of the staff of the Columbia State newspaper, reported the State at the meeting of the Independent Oil company in Washington. At the conclusion of a report of profit's receipt, he makes this reference to himself about the Dargan matter:

"It seems very hard for the public to realize the actual facts in connection with this failure. The State has not had to correct a single statement published in its newspapers in connection with the entire affair, and yet all sorts of wild rumors are current. These rumors refer to the death of Mr. Dargan and they are absolutely incorrect. Mr. Robert Keith Dargan is dead, beyond the shadow of any doubt, reasonable or unreasonable. A most reputable and competent physician after careful examination pronounced the body dead, the Coroner and his jury viewed the body, and the grave in the quiet little graveyard holds in its silent keeping all that was mortal of Robert Keith Dargan."

In too many American homes boys are growing up, not leaving a proper regard for labor. We are not going to place the blame, but we suspect the parents. They have not made the boy do his duty around the home. They have felt that every hour he is out of school brought to devote to play. Play is good thing, and there must be some of it in every young life. But it is better for the boy that he be made to discharge his duties around the home. I was once surprised to know how many people in moderate circumstances hire men to mow their lawns with healthy, strong boys about the premises doing nothing. Anderson says:

"The boy who will be in a position to do the most for the nation of the future, if not the present, is the boy who is not under the control of the county judge or magistrate with the power to hear suits up to \$1,000 and to try all criminal cases outside of those involving capital punishment or over five years in the penitentiary."

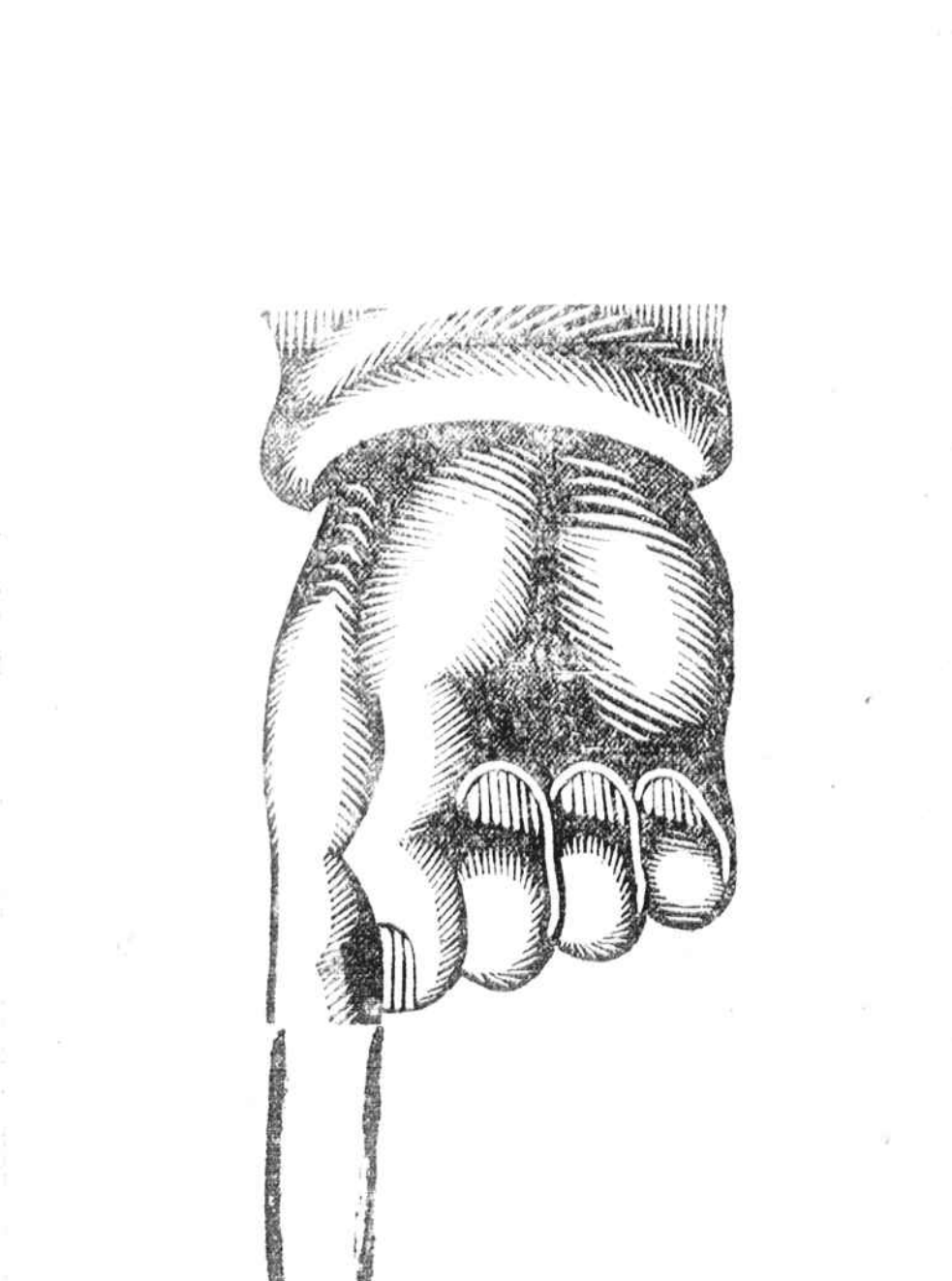
