Camden, 63 155; Stockton, 3 7; Mt. Zion, 5 14; Bla ney, 44 5; McLean's Branch, 1 21; Bethune, 29 26; Raley's Mill, 22 3; Westville, 5 11; Buffalo, 21 1; Liberty Hill, 3 20; Lang's Mill, 16 8; Brewer's Store, 0 5; Shay lor's Hill, 7 10; Rabon's X Roads, 1436.

The above gives a majority of 88 for prohibition. At Hanging Rock there was no election. Kirkley's Store has not been heard from at the hour of going to press ( 5 o'clock.) The Election Commissioners will meet on Tuesday next and declare the result of the election. The official count may cause some slight variations in the above figures, but not enough to change the result.
