The negro teacher here, if we are not mistaken, is paid \$30 or \$35. Now we don't want to appear too hard to please, but we want to be treated at least as well as the darkey. There are about 20 white children here without any school advantages whatever and we do not think it ought to be.

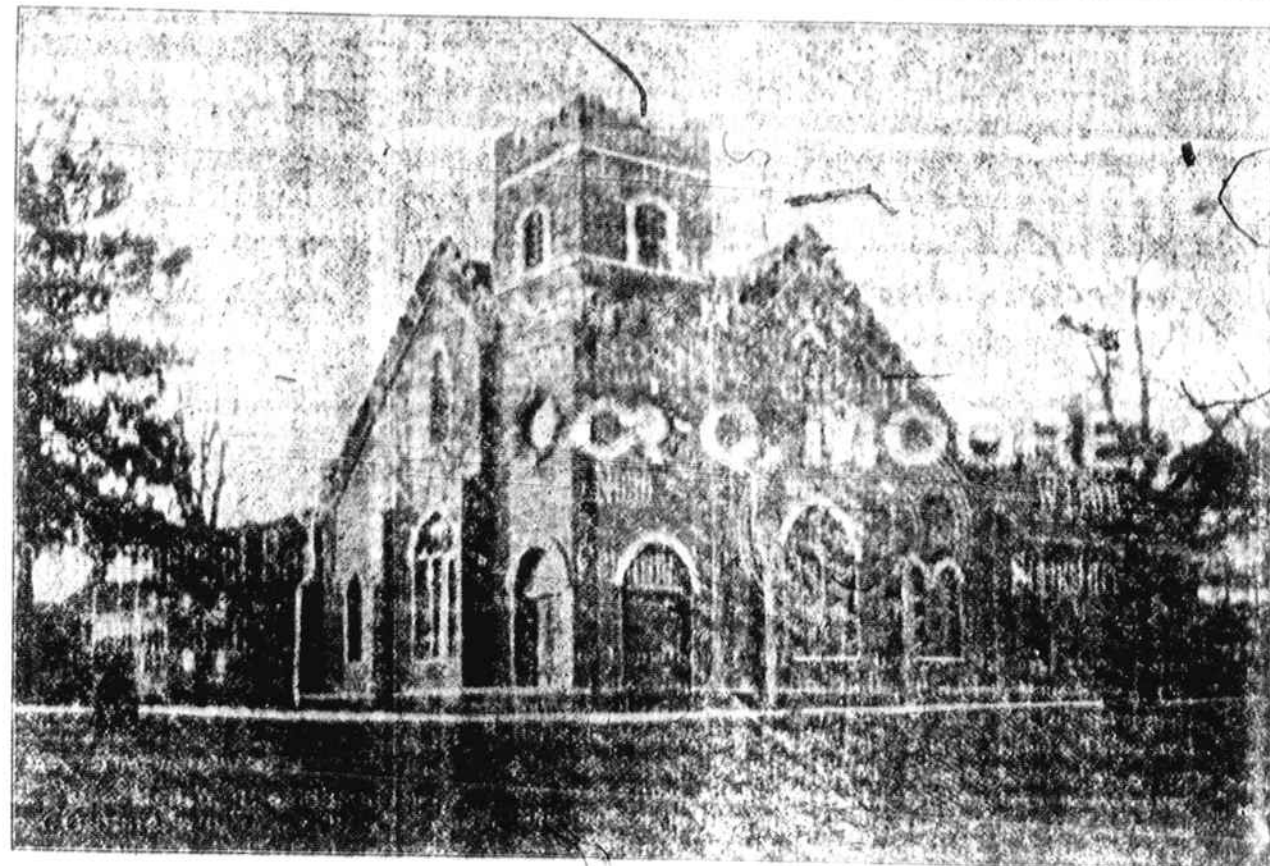
