C.; that all persons having upon their premises within the City of Camden any water closet, urinal, kitchen sink, pantry sink, laundry trays, bathtub, wash-bowl or lavatory shall be and are hereby required to connect same with the public sewerage system of the City of Camden...

The Solicitorship

It is generally hoped that when Governor Axel makes the appointment of a Solicitor in the Fifth Judicial Circuit, on the 1st of May, that Kershaw county will be given some consideration in the matter.

On account of the change of Circuit Court by the last Legislature a part of the Fifth Circuit was cut off. This circuit formerly comprised the counties of Kershaw, Richmond, Edgefield, Saluda and Lexington.

During the recent session of the general assembly a twelfth circuit was formed, due to the always congested condition of the circuit, and the constitution of Edgefield, Saluda and Lexington was annexed to the Twelfth Circuit, while Edgefield and Lexington remained as before in the Fifth Circuit.

It is believed that the Legislature will not cut off Kershaw county from the Twelfth Circuit, as it would be a great loss to the county and the people.
