CONGRESS AT WORK

Doings of Our National Law-Makers Day by Day.

Enjoining State Official.

To meet conflicts between the Fed eral courts and the State authorities such as have arisen during the past year in Minnesota, North Carolina, Alabama and other States the Senate committee on the judiciary reported a bill directing the method of procedere in cases where an effort is made in the Federal courts to enjoin State officials from enforcing State laws. The bill is a compromise between measures introduced by Senators Overman, Bacon and the late Senator Bryan, of Florida, and was reported by Mr. Overman. It has received much attention at the hands of the committee and is intended not only to lessen the frequency of injunctions in such cases, but to modify and soft en the process when it is resorted to It prohibits any one Federal judge from granting such an injunction, but requires that all applications for such orders shall be heard by at least three Federal judges, two of whom shall be eirenit judges, while the third may be either a circuit or a distriet judge. It also requires at least five days' notice to the State authorilies, and grants direct appeal to the Supreme Court of the United States.
