**How They Vote in Florida.**

 Mr. J. E. Williams, former of the News and Herald office, is just back from Florida, where he has been for the past six weeks visiting his acres. While there the first Democratic primary took place. He is very much impressed with the length of the tickets used and the entire canvass that is made for votes. Tickets were packed at him on every head, and it was with difficulty that he persuaded the would-be vote getters that he was not entitled to vote, being from the State of South Carolina.

In Florida they vote for all 28 days from the time to presidential elections, in the primaries, the whole thing being put to the people to decide. Their first primary was held May 19th, and their second primary was to be held just four weeks later. Mr. Williams brought back with him one of the tickets used in the first primary, which looks a great deal more like one sheet of a newspaper than an election ticket. It is three columns wide as printed, being almost as wide as four columns of The News and is 18 inches long, or just two thirds the size of a page of The News.
