## Death of Mrs. Harriet S. Burnet.

Though not expected, the death of Mrs. Harriet Shannon Burnet, which occurred at the residence of Dr. John W. Corbett, on Sunday morning, July 12, is a distinct loss to her family and friends, and to the community in general. Mrs. Burnet was a woman of unusual charm and attraction, and was greatly loved and admired. She was born Nov. 1844, the oldest daughter of Col. and Mrs. W. M. Shannon, and was educated in Camden under the care of Mrs. McCandless, that noted teacher of the late Belmont time. She married, in 1864, Dr. A. W. Burnet, of Charleston, who was at that time a surgeon in the Confederate service, and who afterwards became one of the most skillful and beloved physicians of Camden, who died here about fourteen years ago.

Mrs. Burnet was a gifted and versatile woman and well fitted to adorn any position in society. She was twice elected President of the S. C. Division U. D. C., and by her gracious manner and charming personality, won the love and admiration of all who were so fortunate as to know her. But it was in a large circle of relatives and intimate friends that she was most idolized for her unflinching sweetness of disposition and cheerfulness of temper. For many months she had been a sufferer, and it was beautiful to witness her patience and resignation, with which, surrounded by her devoted family, she prepared to meet her God.

She leaves five daughters, Mrs. John W. Corbett, Mrs. John Whitaker, Mrs. C. C. Whitaker and Misses Margaret and Mary Burnet, and three sons, Mr. W. S. Burnet and Dr. A. W. Burnet of this city and Mr. A. L. Burnet, of Jacksonville, Fla., and a large circle of relatives to whom we extend sympathy.
