Baptists to Celebrate.
 Arrangements are now making for the celebration of the 225th anniversary of the founding of the First Baptist church in Charleston, and it is proposed to make the celebration a memorable event. The First church is the oldest Baptist church in the South, having been founded in 1688. From this congregation came the old Westworth Street church, which later became the Citadel Square church, now the largest congregation in Charleston and the State, some years ago the First church was closed for a long time and the congregation drifted away. Efforts were made to reorganize the church and several ministers served short pastorates, but it was not until the term of the present pastor, Rev. B. Lucy Hoge, that interest has been kindled in the old church and a growing congregation has been organized. Mr. Hoge has brought back to the church a number of old members, has made many converts and has made extensive repairs to the church property. The congregation of the First Baptist church is now large and growing and the church is fast taking place as one of the leading churches of the city.
